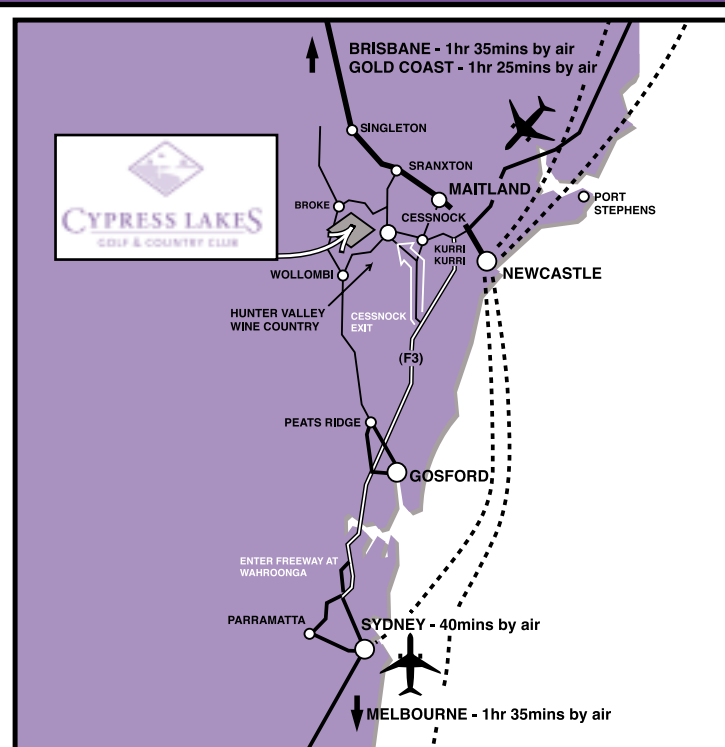

BABYSITTING

- Babysitters can be booked at \$10 per hour for day or night sitting with a local woman. They charge a \$10 booking fee per sitter and will allow one sitter to look after several children.
- We also have the "Critters Club" run by the resort which provides a day care like situation for children over three years of age. The club is run in two sessions: 9am til 1pm and 1pm til 5pm. The sessions are \$20 per child each and lunch can be included for an additional \$10 per child. All of the above obviously must be booked in advance

DIRECTIONS TO CYPRESS LAKES RESORT

- Travel north along National 1 (F3) freeway towards Newcastle (approximately 1 hour)
- Turn off the National 1 (F3) freeway at Cessnock/Kurri Kurri exit and proceed to Cessnock
- As you enter Cessnock along Aberdare Road, turn right at the first set of traffic lights onto Vincent Street (following the directional signs to Branxton). Proceed to the end of Vincent Street. Turn left at traffic lights onto Wollombi Road (following the directional signs to Branxton) and then first right at the traffic lights onto Allandale Road, passing swimming pool on the left and McDonalds Restaurant on the right.
- Proceed along Allandale Road. Five Kilometres out of Cessnock and you will pass the Cessnock Airport on the left-hand side.
- Turn left 500 metres past Airport into Broke Road.
- Follow Broke Road for approximately 3 Kilometres to the "T" intersection
- Turn left at the "T" intersection onto McDonalds Road. Remain on this road, and you will find Cypress Lakes Resort (Thompsons Road) on your right hand side (after Brokenwood and Tamburlaine Wineries)
